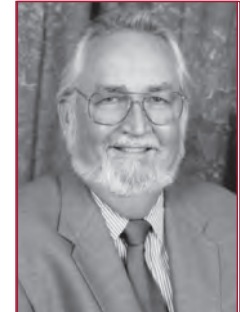

2014 CISCO Events

In recent years, CISCO traditionally hosts three major events - Annual Meeting, Annual Luncheon and Golf Outing. During the Annual Meeting, CISCO presents its Pride in Construction Awards and during the Annual Luncheon, scholarship awards are presented to deserving students.



January's Annual Meeting: University of Illinois' Professor Bob Bruno delivers keynote on research regarding right to work and the cost of repealing the Prevailing Wage Act. More than 260 members and guests were on hand and Pride in Construction Award winners such as Educator of the Year Glen Krause from Evergreen Park High School enjoyed the limelight.



May's Annual Luncheon: More than 300 guests filled Maggiano's in Schaumburg as Keynote Speaker Stephen Beitler, CEO of Chicago Infrastructure Trust, spoke of securing capital for infrastructure and energy efficiency projects in Chicago. Additionally, students such as Amanda Wendt of Willowbrook High School were recognized for their stellar academic performance with college scholarships.



September's Golf Outing: A sold-out course on a gorgeous day was the backdrop for another successful outing as members and supporters were able to network back in the clubhouse for Bloomingdale Golf Course's fantastic barbecue lunch. Plenty of fun prizes were raffled, and due to the generous donations of the golfers, CISCO was able to raise and donate \$1,500 to a local charity called Christmas Without Cancer, which was begun by an oncology nurse at Christ Hospital in Oak Lawn. The partnership theme continued in the area of outreach as CISCO teamed with several organizations and associations to assist in hosting seminars or workshops that served to educate public body personnel, elected officials, union contractors and building trades members on the latest changes in the Prevailing Wage, Employee Misclassification, and Freedom of Information Acts. In addition, the latest on Responsible Bidder Ordinances was often an important topic.



March's Annual ASA Chicago Construction Expo and Safety Conference: CISCO's participation in this annual Oak Brook event, enabled our organization to educate more of the end users and subcontractors on the benefits of using union construction labor and contractors in all of their construction projects.



Project Labor Agreement Workshop: Another springtime workshop saw CISCO and eight other partners and members host a PLA Workshop at the Cement Masons Local #502 facility in Bellwood. More than 120 participants were on hand as Tom Villanova, President of the Chicago & Cook County Building Trades led the discussion on common PLA misconceptions, and walked the group through the standard agreement.



September's Prevailing Wage Seminar: More than 160 attendees comprised of municipal leaders, labor and industry executives, and construction contractors turned out as CISCO, III-FFC, PAMCANI, PCA, Chicago Plumbing Council, UCA, MCA Chicago and other organizations sponsored a half-day workshop to emphasize the tax payer value of the Prevailing Wage Act and the significant training that building trade unions provide (more than \$1 billion annually) for apprentices and journey-level participants.

2014 Partnerships

Building relationships, creating coalitions and generating partnerships have been a successful approach that CISCO has employed throughout many areas. The most prevalent of these areas has been in the Education-to-Careers Program as maintaining a robust union construction labor force is crucial.



In March, CISCO worked with the Chicago Public Schools and the Illinois Department of Transportation to conduct a Hands-on Expo utilizing several trades such as the Laborers, Bricklayers, Carpenters, Pipefitters, and Roofers & Waterproofers to demonstrate basic techniques to the students.



A first-time partnership with the Chicago Teachers Union and St. Paul Church occurred this summer as a Hands-on Expo was held during summer vacation for both students and adults. The expo was hosted by St. Paul Church at its facility on South Wabash Street. Many building trades were represented for participants who got a glimpse of what it is like to do what professionals do every day.



In another example of collaboration among many different entities, CISCO worked once again with the Illinois State Apprentice Committee on the Educator Event. The three-day Hands-on Expo was held in October at the Operating Engineers Local 150 Training Center in Wilmington. The event attracted more than 100 educators from all over Illinois. The goal of the event is to inform the student educators about careers in the building trades, and what better way than to have them experience building trades activities themselves. In turn, the educators can better educate the students due to their hands-on experience.

Plan the work, and work the plan. This axiom is an effective leadership method. CISCO spends many hours and days planning/meeting with other industry executives on legislative advocacy, workforce development, job creation and economic growth. Results are often seen in the form of groundbreaking, ribbon cuttings and press conferences, and 2014 had its share of good news.



In March, CISCO nominated two union construction contractors and an architectural firm for the Daily Herald Business Ledger's AABE (Annual Awards for Business Excellence) program. Michael Kluber of Kluber Architects (left) and Ian Lamp of Lamp, Inc. (right) accepted their awards as Executive Director Dan Allen greeted the winners, as well as others that visited the CISCO booth.



The summer had its share of positive construction news as Governor Pat Quinn asked labor leaders such as Laborers' President Jim Connolly and DuPage Building Trades President John Boske to take center stage at several press conferences to announce (left) renovation of the Jane Addams (I-90) Tollway; (center) expansion of construction job training program called Employ Illinois, and (right) an Illinois Clean Water Initiative in Bensenville.



Labor Day was recognized as CISCO staff attended the Chicago Federation of Labor's special annual event. Many of our state's leaders were on hand, as well as many CISCO members as CFL President Jorge Ramirez provided an historical perspective of the labor movement and spoke of the challenges that lie ahead.

Education-to-Careers

To prevent a union labor shortage in northeastern Illinois, CISCO's Education-to-Careers Program was established to inform highly motivated young men and women on career opportunities in the construction industry.

CISCO's Education-to-Careers Director Johnetta Ryan works with 24 trades across six northeastern Illinois counties. She not only helps young adults, but also those who have already been in the working world to see the benefits of joining an apprenticeship program. In order to promote the apprenticeship programs, she visits high schools, middle schools, vocational colleges, community groups, career fairs and even prisons.

2014 Initiatives

In order to meet the rising labor demands, CISCO forged new partnerships and created the following initiatives aimed at promoting careers in the union construction apprentice programs:

- Hands-On Expo with the Chicago Teachers Union and St. Paul Church - First-time partnership with CTU and St. Paul; Expo was held during summer vacation for both students and adults who were eager to attend.
- St. Paul Church's Step Up To Opportunity Program - CISCO worked with the Church during orientation sessions designed to help students and adults prepare for entry into a US Department of Labor approved apprenticeship program. Pictured (above right) are the graduates of the September, 2014 sessions.
- Boy Scouts of America - This represents a rekindling of a partnership between the scouts and the skilled labor community. The development of a Construction Trade Union Exploring Program is to provide positive and real-world career experiences and leadership development opportunities for young adults in their chosen field of interest.



- ISAC (Illinois State Apprentice Committee) Educator Event - A three-day hands-on expo held at the Operating Engineers Local 150 Training Center in Wilmington (photo at left) in October brought educators from all over the State of Illinois to learn about a variety of construction trades.
- IDOT/CPS - CISCO again partnered with the Department of Transportation and Chicago Public Schools to provide a Hands-On Expo in the Fall for students with an interest in the building trades.
- TCART (Transportation Construction Apprenticeship Readiness Training) - Entering its second year, this program's goal is to insure increased participation of

minority groups, disadvantaged persons and females in all phases of the highway construction industry. The first year resulted in 100 people who found jobs in the trades.

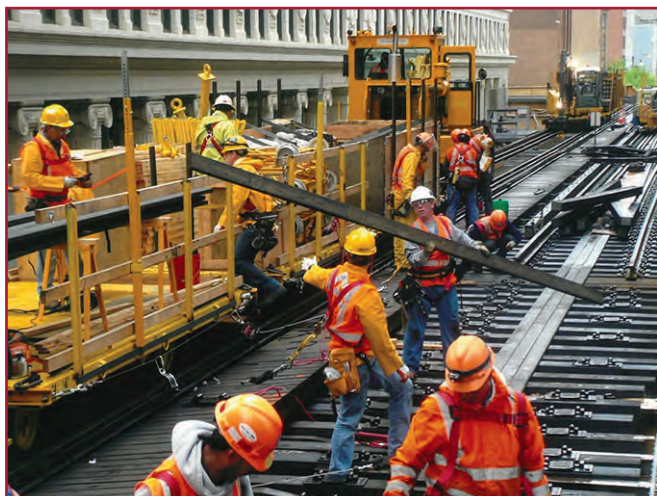

Legislative Committee

While CISCO's Legislative Committee had another busy year keeping representatives of labor and management aware of current and pending legislation affecting the union construction industry, the overwhelming headline of 2014 was the campaign between Bruce Rauner and Governor Pat Quinn leading up to the election of Bruce Rauner as the State's first Republican Governor in 12 years. With the Senate and the House still holding Democratic super-majorities, a new era of partisanship was being touted by the incoming administration.



The main topic during the Legislative Committee's initial, post-election meeting, centered on the new Governor's pivotal role of making new appointments to many key agencies such as the Department of Labor and the Capital Development Board. Adjusting to new leadership in many traditional labor-friendly agencies will be one of the biggest challenges in 2015.

During the year, the following bills signed into law, represent a sampling of the legislation that had a profound impact on the union construction industry:

HB 3794 (Capital Bill) – Jump started a \$1.1 billion projects bill, specifically for improvement of state and local highways, arterial highways, roads, access areas, roadside shelters, rest areas and fringe parking facilities and sanitary facilities.

SB 3224 (Capital Bill Funding) – The funding mechanism that is paying for the capital bill.

SB 3287 (Workers Comp Amendment) – Eliminates the workers' compensation exclusive remedy/immunity enjoyed by service companies that provide safety consulting unless those companies are wholly-owned by the employer, insurance broker or the insurer. Signed into law as Public Act 098-0633.

HB 3793 – First step in paying off some of the debt owed to many state employees for back wages earned from July 2011 to July 2013.

SB 346 – Requires chief executives of all companies seeking the EDGE tax credit to sign a document that states they would not expand in Illinois without the tax credit. Those looking for the EDGE tax credit to relocate or expand in Illinois would have to create new jobs, rather than simply retain the ones they have.

SB 3023 – Prevents the subordination of mechanics liens, and keeps the banks from circumventing the legislative fix that ended the 2011 Supreme Court ruling, called Cypress Creek.

CISCO's Legislative Committee also appointed Jeff Weiss as Management Co-Chair. Weiss, Director of Communications & Public Affairs for PAMCANI and the PCA (Plumbing Contractors Association of Chicago and Cook County), has enjoyed an extensive labor career with the Chicago Federation of Labor, AFL-CIO and the United Food & Commercial Workers Union (Local 1546 and 881).

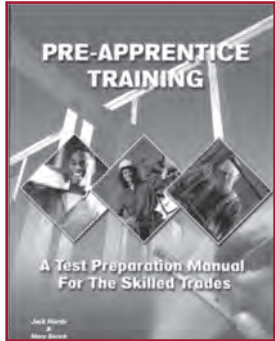
