## WHO SHOULD ATTEND THE WORKSHOP

This workshop is ideal for members of the building trades, employer associations and public or municipal procurement professionals in the surrounding area.

## WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

This workshop will feature the following:

- **Prevailing Wage** - You'll learn about recent legislation, complying with record keeping requirements and adhering to complex guidelines surrounding wage determination. The Illinois Department of Labor's Mediation and Conciliation Division experts will include a review of how to file comprehensive complaints geared toward better outcomes.

IDOL staff will also spell out the methods to respond to audits and investigations and how to avoid penalties and other consequences for failing to comply with the Prevailing Wage Act. There is also a review of when public bodies are liable for penalties.

- **Employee Classification Act** - A review of the misclassification of workers as "independent contractors". The Department of Labor will provide case examples of final determinations against violators.

- **Freedom of Information Act** - Learn about your legal obligation as a public body employee to ensure that Illinois residents can obtain government information, and how the new changes will provide individuals requesting information with a more transparent and accountable government.

- **Responsible Bidder Ordinance (RBO) Options** - Learn about new RBO requirements, benefits and the value it provides taxpayers.

## ABOUT PREVAILING WAGE

Prevailing Wage is a mandatory component of many public works projects. Unfortunately, the law often raises more questions than it answers. What is the prevailing wage? What paperwork do I need? How can I avoid liability and complaints? What if I need help?
