CARPENTERS DONATE WORK TO IMPROVE CHARITY TRAINING CENTER

In the spirit of giving during the holidays, members of the Carpenters Local 1185 chipped in to refurbish the floors, baseboards, doors and other items at Chicago's Gateway to Learning Training Center - a special education center that provides services for individuals with intellectual disabilities. The work was done the day before and the weekend after Thanksgiving.

Damage caused by a leaking dishwasher was the reason the work was needed, and the Carpenters seized on the opportunity to do a good deed for a worthy cause. Manpower was donated by the Professional Flooring Installers Association, while the materials, called Eco-Grip, were donated by KJL Commercial.

"The Carpenters really saved the day for us," said Kathy Lavin, Executive Director, Gateway to Learning. "This story demonstrates how our organization, and the men and women of the union construction industry, share the same values of giving back to the community."

In addition, the Emmy-nominated

series Built to Last - an informative show exploring the skill and training of trade union members and contractors - was on-hand to film the generosity of the local union and contractors.
