### **CISCO LUNCHEON A SMASH HIT**

CISCO's first post-pandemic event was an enormous success as 450 guests came to the IBEW 134 Hall in Chicago to hear Keynote Speaker Chicago Mayor Lori Lightfoot, and Guest Speaker U.S. Senator Dick Durbin give rousing accounts about the power of education, the importance of union jobs to our economy, and our country's future infrastructure plan.

The guests were also treated to CISCO's dual presentations of its 2021 Scholarship Awards, as well as the 2020 Pride in Construction Awards.

Mayor Lightfoot stated in her remarks that "It's union workers who build and repair the roads and bridges we drive on, lay



the concrete on the sidewalks, where we walk, run and play, and install the foundation and plumbing for the homes we live in, the buildings where we work, the schools we learn in, and the hospital where we go to get better."

"From the inside out, she continued, steady union hands have made our cities and our neighborhoods stronger, more stable and more beautiful. And if you need proof, look no further than our great city, which was built from the ground up by union labor."

During Senator Durbin's remarks, he made the case for passing President Biden's \$1 trillion plan to invest in upgrading



the nation's infrastructure of roads, bridges, ports, airports, transit systems and more. "The country and Illinois needs this bill to pass more than ever," Durbin said. "Decades of declining public investment has left our roads, bridges, rail and transit systems in poor condition."

"Wednesday (today) the Senate will conduct a "test vote" on the latest compromise proposal, and we will do everything in our power to get this much needed legislation to become reality," Durbin added.

Prior to the Mayor's remarks, Executive Director Dan Allen introduced the scholarship winners and they were joined by the Mayor, Board President Dave Henderson and Board Member Melanie Izral.
