

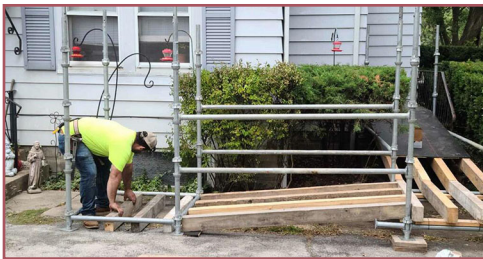

LABORERS BUILD ACCESSIBLE RAMP FOR RETIRED STATE POLICE EMPLOYEE

Members of several Chicago area Laborers' Unions volunteered their time and talent to build a handicap accessible ramp, on a Saturday morning last month, to help a disabled Illinois State Police employee, who had retired after 32 years of service.

The woman, Terri Wysocki of Matteson said, "They did a fantastic job and it was just in time as my sister passed, and it enabled me to get to her funeral service."

The men built the accessible ramp so she could get into and out of her home to go to therapy. Materials were graciously provided by Chicago Area Scaffold Association (CASA) member Prime Scaffold Inc.
