




Last year's scholarship winners are recognized as CISCO Board President Maurice King proudly joins in.

RCEC's HOSTS ANNUAL ECONOMIC CONFERENCE

The Residential Construction Employer Council held its annual Economic Conference for about 75 attendees and heard forecasts from a member of the Federal Reserve Bank (FRB) of Chicago and Tracy Cross & Associates, Inc.

William Strauss of Chicago's FRB summarized that the outlook is for the U.S. economy to expand at a pace above trend in 2018 and 2019, and close to trend in 2020 and 2021.

In addition Strauss said that employment is expected to rise moderately with the unemployment rate remaining very low; inflation is forecast to be at the Fed's inflation target through 2021; housing is predicted to improve at a modest pace; while manufacturing output is expected to increase at a rate above trend in 2018 and rise at a slower pace in 2019.
